Key Verse

But when they judge died, the people returned to ways even more corrupt than those of their fathers, following other gods and serving and worshiping them.


They refused to give up their evil practices and stubborn ways.

Judges

fter Joshua dies, the Israelites lose their focus regarding God. They enter a period in which they often turn to pagan gods, only to turn back to God after defeat or catastrophic event. The cycle in a nutshell:

- 1. Israel forgets God; worships pagan gods instead
- 2. God allows enemies to oppress Israel
- 3. Israel prays to God for deliverance
- 4. God raises up a leader, called a judge, to deliver them from their enemies
- 5. Peace comes, generally until the death of the judge, then return to step 1.
