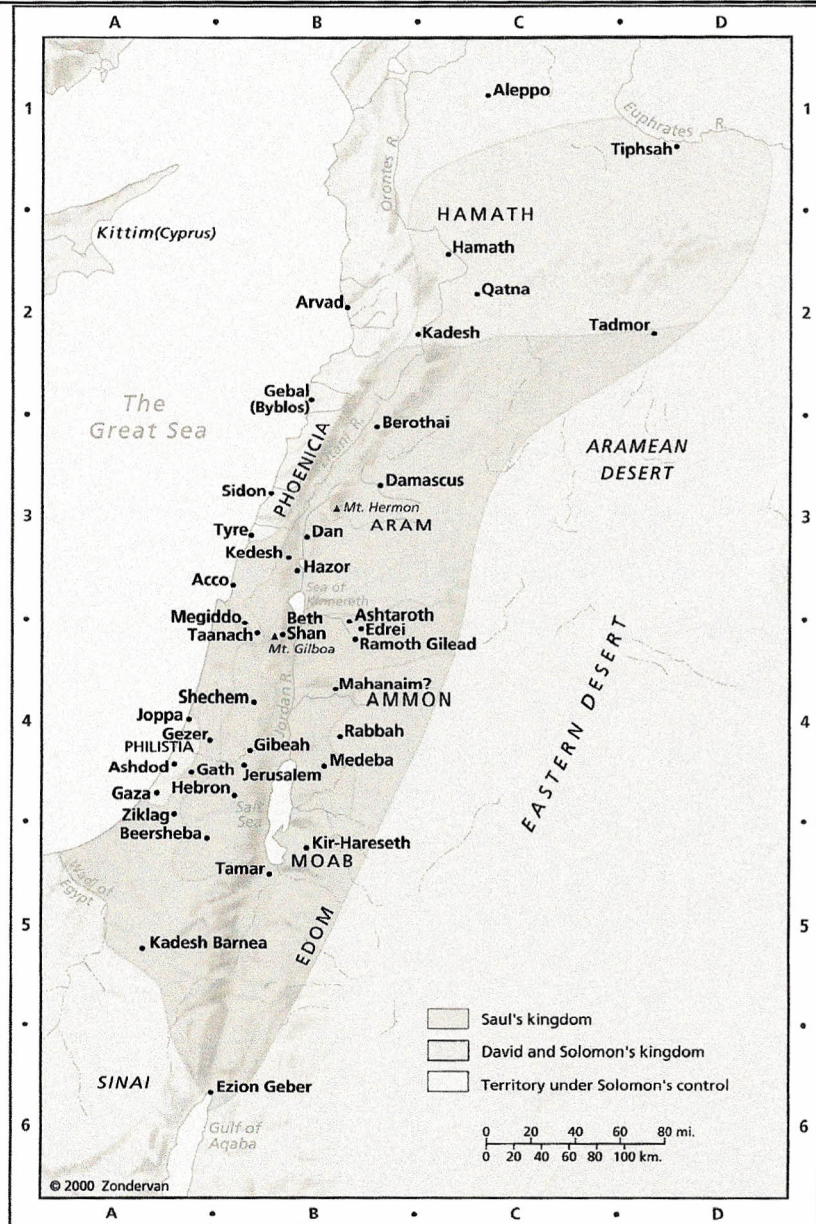


1 Chronicles

Covers many of the same events as 2 Samuel, but from a different editorial perspective. This book was written almost 500 years after David's reign, presumably to inspire Judeans who are just returning to Jerusalem from exile. The focus is on remembering David's line in a positive light.

LOOKING FORWARD TO JESUS

Chapter 3 of this book chronicles the royal line, showing how God is keeping His promise in having a son of David lead Israel. The promise kept thus far is simply a precursor to the descendant we meet in the New Testament.

PEOPLE

Abram/Abraham father of the Hebrew nation; father of Isaac and Ishmael; grandfather of Jacob and Esau **Amorites** enemy of Israel living in Canaan **Arameans** people from the plain extending east from the Lebanon Mountains past the Euphrates River **Asher** tribe descended from Jacob's eighth son **Benjamin** tribe descended from Jacob's twelfth son **Bathsheba** after committing adultery with David, she becomes David's queen, the mother of Solomon, and an ancestor of Christ **Caleb Canaan** father (and land) of the Hittites, Jebusites, Amorites, Girgashites, and Hivites **Cush** land thought to be near Mesopotamia, in the vicinity of the Garden of Eden **Dan** tribe descended from Jacob's fifth son **David** slayer of Goliath and second king of Israel, David is flawed yet demonstrates a great heart for God; ancestor of Christ **Ephraim** tribe descended from the second son of Joseph, who received the firstborn's blessing; considered one of the twelve tribes of Israel **Esau/Edom** first son of Isaac and Rebekah; Jacob's older brother **Gad** tribe descended from Jacob's seventh son **Gad the seer** **Girgashites** **Ham** son of Noah, cursed by him, becomes ancestor of the Canaanites and Philistines **Hittites** ancient tribe living in Canaan **Hivites** **Isaac** Abraham's second son, by Sarah; father of Jacob and Esau **Ishmael** Abraham's first son, by Hagar; ancestor of... **Issachar** tribe descended from Jacob's ninth son **Jacob/Israel** second son of Isaac and Rebekah; younger twin of Esau; father of the twelve tribes of Israel **Japheth** son of Noah, blessed by him **Jebusites** inhabitants of the ancient city of Jebus, which later becomes Jerusalem **Joab** commander of David's army; David's nephew; brother of Asahel and Abishai **Jonathan** son of Saul, best friend of David **Judah** tribe descended from Jacob's fourth son **Levi/Levites** descendants of Jacob's third son **Manasseh** tribe descended from the first son of Joseph, who lost the firstborn's blessing to his younger brother Ephraim; considered one of the twelve tribes of Israel **Naphtali** tribe descended from Jacob's sixth son **Nathan** a prophet in the court of both David and Solomon; he enlightens David regarding his sinfulness by telling the parable of the ewe lamb **Noah** a righteous man, chosen by God to build an ark to save his family, mankind, and the animal kingdom from a worldwide flood **Perez** eldest son of Judah **Philistines** settlers in Canaan, the people of Philistia battle with Israel throughout the ages of the judges and kings **Reuben** descendants of Jacob's eldest son **Samuel** prophet, priest, and Israel's last judge, Samuel anoints Saul and then David as king **Saul** Israel's first king, he loses God's support by not following Him faithfully, then failing to repent **Shem** son of Noah, blessed by him, becomes ancestor of the Semites **Simeon** tribe descended from Jacob's second son **Solomon** son of David and Bathsheba, successor to David, he becomes with wisest and richest man in the world; the third and last king of the united Israel **Uzzah** a man struck dead by God for touching the ark of God without authorization **Zebulun** tribe descended from Jacob's tenth son

TERMS

ephod a linen apron, often worn by priests **Temple** the building where Israel worshipped and offered sacrifices to God **Tent of Meeting** portable worship facility first erected in the Wilderness; also known as the Tabernacle
