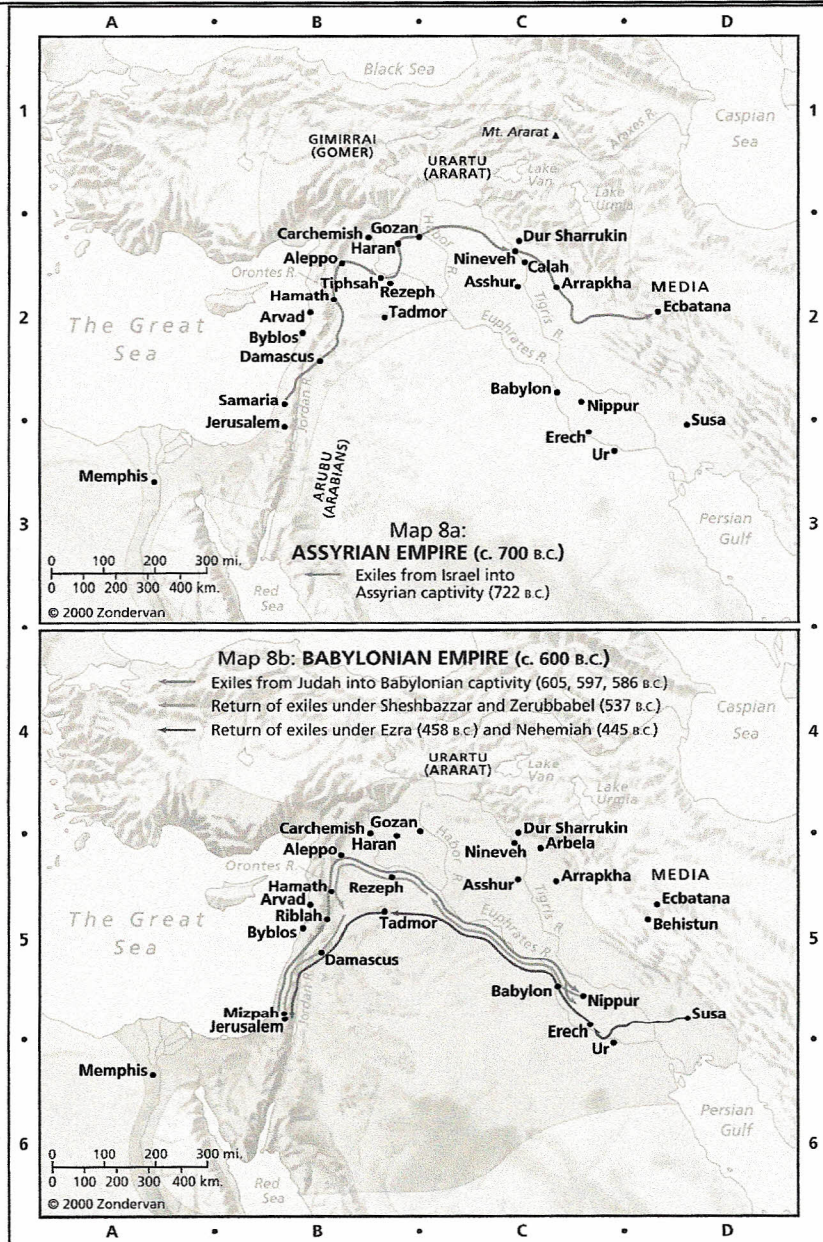


# Daniel

**Ancient of Days God Anointed One Christ Abednego** (Azariah) one of three friends of Daniel (Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego) who become government officials before being thrown in — and surviving — a fiery furnace **Belshazzar** the last king of Babylon, he witnesses the handwriting on the wall **Cyrus** king of Persia who allows the Hebrews to return to Jerusalem **Daniel** becomes Belteshazzar **Darius the Mede** a king of Persia during the time of Daniel **Gabriel** an archangel **Shadrach** (Hananiah) one of three friends of Daniel (Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego) who become government officials before being thrown in — and surviving — a fiery furnace **Jehoikim** king of Judah who was placed on the throne by Pharaoh **Michael** an archangel **Medes** a nation south of the Caspian Sea **Meshach** (Mishael) one of three friends of Daniel (Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego) who become government officials before being thrown in — and surviving — a fiery furnace **Nebuchadnezzar** king of Babylon, enabled by God to conquer Jerusalem and exile Judah

**PLACES**

**Babylon** the capital city of Babylonia, the empire that defeated Jerusalem and exiled Judah **Greece** a powerful nation north of the Mediterranean Sea **Jerusalem** capital of the Southern Kingdom of Judah

**TERMS**

**abomination that causes desolation** a particularly detestable thing **archangel** a chief angel or messenger from God **Law of Moses** the law as described in the Ten Commandments and the Penteteuch (*Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy*) **magistrate** civil authority, ruler or judge **prefect** a presiding or chief officer **righteous** right with God **satrap** governor
